## Toys & Games with a Twist Opening Reception at BCA's Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos on Wednesday, December 7, 2011

(November 29, 2011 — Bronx, NY) The Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos, the contemporary art center of the Bronx Council on the Arts (BCA), presents *Toys & Games with a Twist*, an exhibition of work by over 30 artists on view in the Main Gallery through February 1, 2012. Curated by Juanita Lanzo and Vanessa Gonzalez, the show focuses on how toys are used to comment on sociopolitical issues and current topics. The opening reception will be held on Wednesday, December 7, from 5:00-9:00pm, in conjunction with that evening's Bronx Culture Trolley. Longwood is located on the campus of Hostos Community College at 450 Grand Concourse at 149th Street. Admission is free and all are welcome.

Toys & Games with a Twist investigates and comments on issues of construction of gender roles and stereotypes, consumerism, hierarchies of power, globalization, migration, memory and loss, fantasy, the environment, love, war, violence, urban and popular culture. For Toys and Games with a Twist, Longwood is partnering with Curate NYC, a juried exhibition and online marketplace that exists to heighten exposure and opportunities for New York City visual artists. The project also helps promote New York City's image as a vital cultural hub. Launched in 2010 by Full Spectrum Experience, Inc. and the New York City Economic Development Corporation, Curate NYC provides a free online platform for curators, collectors, and art lovers everywhere to discover work by hundreds of local artists. Last year, Curate NYC attracted 1,200 entries in three weeks. The project generated 600,000 website hits in three weeks, and positive news in The Huffington Post, The New York Times, The L Magazine, and on The Brian Lehrer Show. In 2011, one art gallery per borough will curate and exhibit their own shows of actual works by Curate NYC artists. After the call-for-entries, we will open the Curate NYC E-Marketplace, allowing artists to upload more than one entry and to sell the work from their website.

About the Curators: Juanita Lanzo has been the Director and Curator of Longwood Art Gallery since 2008. She has organized Longwood Arts Project's 25th Anniversary Digital Matrix at Haven Art Gallery and Material Culture ...in the City: Memory, Places and Spaces at Longwood Art Gallery @ Hostos. Publications include an essay for Chakaia Booker for the Bronx Museum of the Art's 25th anniversary catalogue Collection Remixed. Ms. Lanzo graduated from City College of New York (MFA) and from University of Puerto Rico (BFA). Vanessa Gonzalez received her B.A. in art history from SUNY Purchase in 2008. She is an aspiring Bronx-based curator who has a fascination with the intersections of technology, pop culture, art activism and digital art. Vanessa strongly believes in work with potential to change the world. She has curated shows for BAAD! (Bronx Academy for Arts and Dance) and Nuyorican Poets Cafe. Vanessa currently works at the Bronx Council on the Arts as an Assistant Project Coordinator. She is also the assistant to the director of the Bronx Heroes Comic Con.
