

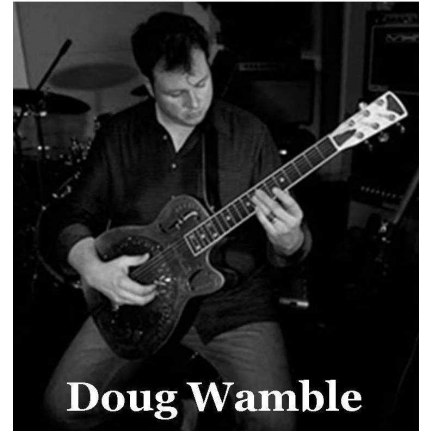

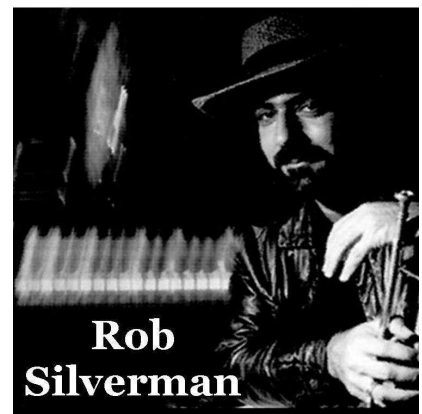
**Bronx Council on the Arts and Wave Hill kick off  
2012 "BxIndie Music at Sunset Wednesdays" on July 11th**

Eight performances will run on eight consecutive Wednesdays beginning July 11th through August 29th at 7:00pm. Bring your own folding chair and enjoy a mix that includes jazz and blues trios, classical ensembles and Celtic music, on instruments as varied as the banjo, the bodhrán and the button accordion. All concerts are free with admission to the grounds: Free to Wave Hill members and children under 6; \$8 for adults; \$4 for students and seniors 65+; \$2 for children 6-18. 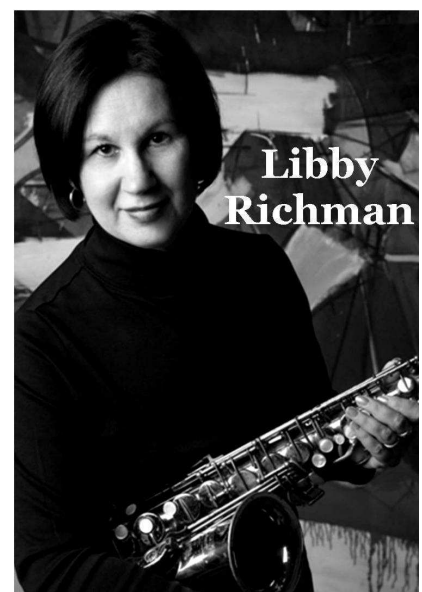
**On Wednesday, July 11th at 7:00pm**, spend an evening with **Jazz Guitarist Doug Wamble**. A native of Memphis, TN, Doug Wamble has always been surrounded by a vast musical and cultural landscape. Since moving to New York City, he has performed and recorded with artists such as Wynton Marsalis, Cassandra Wilson, Branford Marsalis, Bill Frisell and Charlie Hunter. Doug has composed and performed original works for the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra and Chamber Music America. He has performed film soundtracks for acclaimed documentarian Ken Burns including *The Tenth Inning*, *Prohibition* and *The Central Park Five*. Doug has released three solo albums: *Country Libations* and *Bluestate* on Marsalis Music/Universal Records and *Doug Wamble* on E1/Koch Records.



**On Wednesday, July 18th at 7:00pm**, the **Robert Silverman Jazz and Blues Trio** performs. Robert Silverman is a pianist, trumpeter, and composer who has been a fixture in the New York Jazz scene since 1985. After a stint in Europe and assorted gigs with Albert King, Jimmy Heath, George Russell, Cecil McBee and the Ron Levy Bluesman band, Robert went on to form his own ensemble featuring original compositions, the blues and standards. Mr. Silverman has been featured in New York on NBC TV, WKCR, WBAI and WNYC Radio's Around New York. He is the recipient of two "Meet the Composer Grants".



**On Wednesday, July 25th at 7:00pm**, the **Libby Richman Quartet** offers a program of smooth jazz that combines original music and standards. Composer, reed player Libby Richman leads an ensemble that plays original contemporary jazz. Libby has released three CDs, her sound echoing the influences of Classical, Latin, and Pop music. She has traveled widely as a professional musician, leading her jazz quartet and, as a side musician, for big bands as and theatrical productions. Libby lives in the Bronx and performs all over the tri-state area. In addition to jazz concerts, she entertains in residences and for senior groups with her *Musical Journey* programs. Originally from Indiana, Libby, a *Meet the Composer* grant recipient, received her BA from the University of Massachusetts.
